

MOL Pakistan's Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Newsletter Issue No. 2 - June, 2020

This Newsletter provides our colleagues and peers with information about MOL Pakistan's Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives across the country. We would like to take this opportunity to share with you some of the wonderful work being done by our Corporate Affairs team, people who are passionate about bringing positive change to our local communities, through the hard work and dedication of the Community Development Department.

MOL Pakistan's commitment to improving the health and well-being of our local communities in our areas of operation

As the health and well-being of our local communities is a priority for MOL Pakistan, we regularly provide free medical and eye camps. Along with community health services, our CSR initiatives also include working with the government to ensure that healthcare facilities are available to meet the needs of our local communities. For example, in the village of Darmalak, Tehsil Lachi, District Kohat, in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, due to the poor condition of a civil dispensary with limited facilities, MOL Pakistan assisted in the building construction of two rooms and renovated residential facilities for medical staff. With an estimated total cost of **PKR 3 Million**, these well-needed improvements enabled the community facility to provide healthcare services to over **7,000 beneficiaries**. On December 7th, 2019, the Centre was inaugurated by Mr. Shehryar Khan Afridi, Minister of State for Narcotics Control and States and Frontier Regions (SAFRON).

Likewise, MOL Pakistan has also taken up the construction of other healthcare facilities in the area, including basic health units in the villages of Gurguri, Makori and Bahadar Khel in the district of Karak, as well as a civil dispensary in Annar Chena in the district of Hangu.



MOL Pakistan's CSR initiatives providing water aid through the construction of check dams in our local communities

The overall shortage of water is a major problem faced by our local communities in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The scarcity of water for human consumption and the cultivation of plants and livestock through agriculture, and the implication of environmental issues such as soil and water conservation are all concerns facing our local communities. To help alleviate this problem, and address water issues and concerns, MOL Pakistan's CSR initiatives include the construction of check dams in our local communities. With the approval of the Social Welfare Committee, these check dams are made at the direct request of our local communities or based on recommendations of their elected representatives such as their Member of National Assembly (MNA). As such, work is currently underway on five check dams in Tal Block.



Village Tolanj, Union Council Ghumbat, Tehsil Ghumbat, District Kohat: Completed in March 2020, with an estimated total cost of **PKR 7 Million**, the construction of a check dam was undertaken with a pondage capacity of 30 acre feet and the ability to irrigate over 350 acres of agricultural land, benefiting **25 to 30 families** living in the village.



Village Chamba Gul, Union Council Kotki, District Hangu: Completed in May 2020, with an estimated total cost of **PKR 5.4 Million**, the construction of a check dam was undertaken with a catchment area of one square kilometer and the ability to irrigate over 30 acres of agricultural land and the ability to store approximately 10 acres of feed water, benefiting over **4,000 villagers**.

Village Barbara, Tehsil Banda Daud Shah, District Karak: Completed in October 2019, with an estimated total cost of **PKR 4.3 Million**, the construction of a check dam was undertaken with a pondage capacity of 248,625 cubic feet and catchment area of 600 feet and the ability to irrigate over 3 acres of agricultural land and store approximately 30,000 gallons, benefiting over **500 families**.



MOL Pakistan's Mobile Health Unit (MHU) at Manzalai-CPF

While MOL Pakistan has operationalized robust anti-pandemic efforts for the prevention, identification, isolation, quarantine and evacuation of our colleagues infected or suspected of infection, the Mobile Health Unit (MHU), a CSR initiative of the Community Development Department, used in providing free medical and eye camps, is now an important asset in the fight against COVID-19.

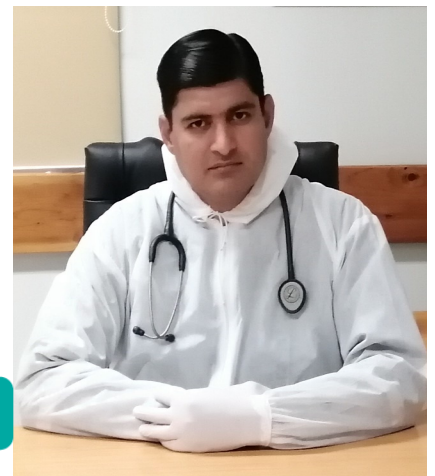
Stationed at the entrance gate of the Manzalai Field Central Processing Facility (Manzalai-CPF) located in Manzalai, District Karak, the MHU has so far performed **613 rapid tests**. As such, the MHU is the designated facility at Manzalai-CPF providing safe and reliable rapid testing for COVID-19. Taking only **15 to 20 minutes**, test results are provided on-site in the comfort and safety of this state-of-the-art facility.

Fully equipped with all the necessities, the MHU offers a highly sanitized and disinfected, ventilated and air conditioned office where patient privacy is maintained. Medical staff and patients are provided with comfortable seating and a full length stretcher for their use.
