MOL Pakistan provides Free Eye Camps to local communities in our areas of operation



MOL Pakistan's free eye camp was held at Urbashi Village, District Karak, about two kilometers away from Manzalai Gas Plant Facility (GPF). Garnering much interest from local communities in the area, over **700 patients** availed free healthcare at MOL Pakistan's free eye camp staffed by our implementing partner, **Al-Shifa Trust Eye Hospital**. Treated at MOL Pakistan's free eye camp were the elderly, children, 350 men, and 370 women, of whom 360 were given medication, 90 were referred to the hospital for further medical investigation, while 11 patients were taken by **Al-Shifa Trust Eye Hospital**

transportation to the hospital for admittance. **Mr. Syed Fahad Iftikhar, Assistant Commissioner (AC) Tehsil Banda Daud Shah, District Karak** was present at MOL Pakistan's free eye camp and appreciated the company's corporate social responsibility (CSR) initiative at the service of the local community. He stated, "I am grateful to MOL Pakistan for this CSR initiative that improves the health and well-being of the local community residing in the company's areas of operation. Such CSR initiatives are important to the residents of the surrounding area who do not have the means to travel to far away hospitals and clinics when they need to most. Therefore, this CSR initiative helps local communities in their times of need and helps foster goodwill amongst all stakeholders."

MOL Pakistan provides IT equipment and water filtration plant to residents of Margala Block in partnership with the National Highway and Motorway Police (NHMP)



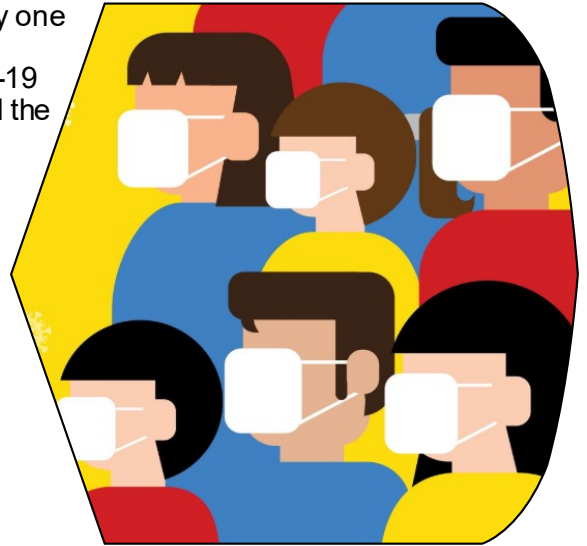

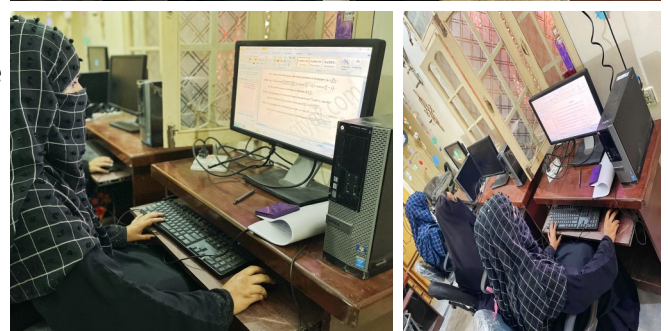
MOL Pakistan provides Social Welfare Program funding to Women's Technical Vocational Training Centre in Lachi (Urban), District Kohat



MOL Pakistan in partnership with the Tal Block consortium provided social welfare program funding of **PKR 2.5 Million** to the Technical Vocational Training Centre for Women in Lachi (Urban) Tehsil, District Kohat. Both, Chief Guests, **Mr. Roshan Mahsud, Deputy Commissioner (DC), Kohat District** and **Mr. Hussain Khattak, District Officer (DO), Social Welfare Department, Kohat District** gladly received the social welfare funding provided by MOL Pakistan. At the cheque distribution ceremony, this social welfare funding was greatly appreciated by the local community of Lachi along with the district administration of Kohat District. **Mr. Roshan Mahsud, Deputy Commissioner (DC), Kohat** was particularly impressed by the company's efforts to empower women. With about **100 students** currently enrolled in sewing, beautician, and computer programs at the centre, also providing a monthly stipend of **PKR 1,000 to each student**, he thanked MOL Pakistan for initiating this centre back in December 2019 and acknowledged MOL Pakistan's on-going support to the social welfare program of District Kohat.



The centre offers three (3) programs; computer training, beautician training, and sewing and stitching training to women of all ages and educational backgrounds. The centre is child-friendly and operates at full capacity all year long. It is also gaining popularity and notoriety with local residents as well as the local government. Students of the centre, including sisters Ms. Maira Umar Hayyat, age 17, and Ms. Sofia Umar Hayyat, age 22, are very proud of their work in all three (3) programs and have decided to pursue higher studies and take up teaching as their chosen professions. Inspired by their time at the centre the sisters hope to contribute to women's empowerment in their community by becoming teachers. The sisters have also voiced their concerns about the lack of funding given to women's centres such as this, and at the ceremony they requested representatives of local government in attendance to increase municipal and provincial funding for women's empowerment initiatives in the area.
