MOL Pakistan commemorates International Women's Day (IWD) in District Kohat



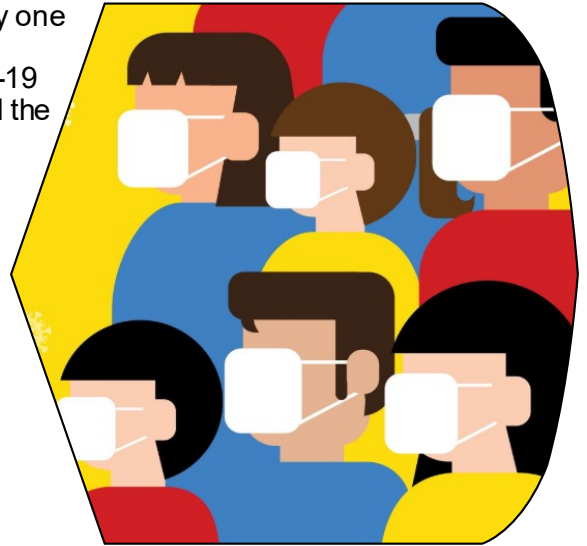

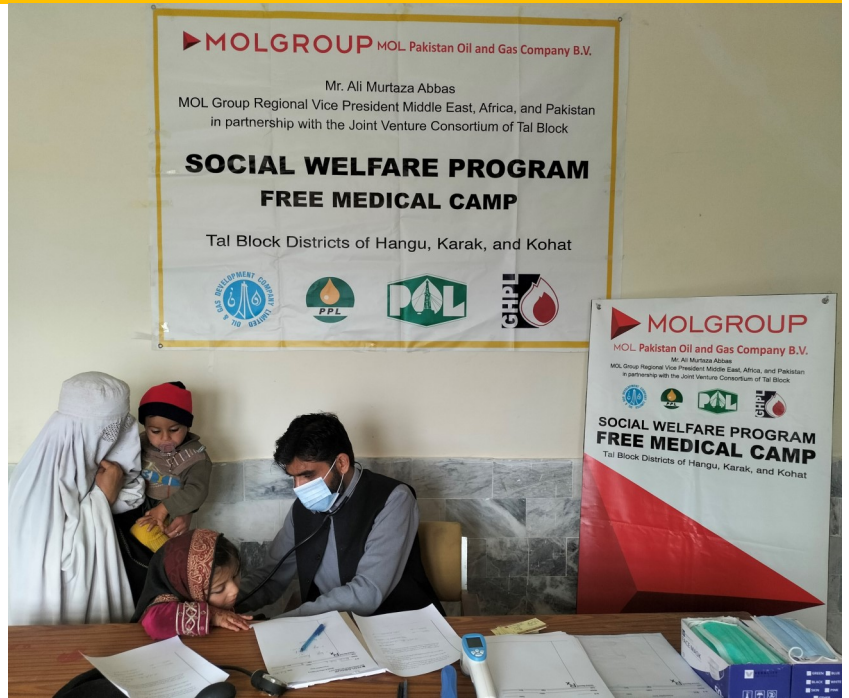

MOL Pakistan provides Free Medical Camps to local communities in Tal Block through Mobile Health Unit (MHU)

MOL Pakistan provides Free Eye Camps and Medical Camps to local communities in Tal Block



MOL Pakistan in partnership with the Joint Venture Consortium of Tal Block provided a free eye camp and free medical camp through the Basic Health Unit (BHU) Serki Chamba Gul, District Hangu, where a total of **1221 patients** received free healthcare. Both Mr. Capt(R) Sarmad Saleem Akram, Deputy Commissioner, District Hangu and Mr. Dost Muhammad, District Health Officer (DHO), District Hangu appreciated the company's social welfare programs to provide free accessible healthcare to local residents of the area. Outpatient healthcare included medical specializations in surgery, gynecology, and optometry in order to serve men, women, children and senior citizens, who flocked to receive medical attention from trained professionals they would not otherwise have easy access to. Local residents normally have to travel great distances to see far away doctors and specialists at clinics and hospitals in urban city centers.
